## McDonoug h business earns impressive recognition

McDonough based Bennett International Group was honored last month by being named a runner-up for the 2010 Georgia Family Business of the Year Awards, by the Cox Family Enterprise Center at Kennesaw State University's Coles College of Business.

Bennett, a trucking /transportation company, was selected as a finalist in the large business category, and although today Bennett International is a leader in the trucking and transport industry, 36 years ago the company was a fledgling familyowned business with two customers and five trucks. Under the leadership of Marcia G. Taylor, it has grown into an international full-service transportation company with thousands of customers worldwide.

Taylor and her late husband, J.D. Garrison, bought the company in 1974 and together they helped grow it to the industry leader it is today. "We had about \$500 in capital and bought Bennett on credit," said Taylor

According to Asia Grimes, Director of Marketing, Bennett International Group currently has 574 employees, 2,500 independent owner/operators and a network of 220 Bennett agents throughout the world.

The company has eight divisions including trucking and specialized freight transport, warehousing and distribution, import and export, drive away vehicle transport, manufactured housing transport, brokerage and portable building manufacturing, with revenues of more than \$270 million.

Taylor is quick to credit the company's success to the hard work and dedication of her family and employees, as well as the company's core values. Taylor's two sons, David and Danny Lowry and daughter Lynette Alt are all board member as well as co-owners, and head up different divisions within the company, having started working in the family business back in high
